PASTOR'S CORNER

As we head into summer, I am reminded of a song sung by Nat King Cole, which begins with the words, "Roll out those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer...." That's how I remember many summers when I was growing up. By the time the "dog days" of August rolled around, those days got boring as well.

Pentecost is the season of the Spirit, ending with Trinity Sunday next week and followed by what we call "ordinary time" on the liturgical calendar. No doubt the lazy, hazy crazy days have already begun, especially for those getting out of school. For a lot of them I suppose it's a time for the release of a lot of pent up energy. Pentecost celebrates the release of the Holy Spirit upon the church to imbue it with energy, vision, and courage. How do we recognize the Spirit in our midst? In acts it is described as the sound of a "mighty wind," or "tongues of flame" dancing on the people's heads. That's quite and image. We know what fire and wind can do in nature: it can reap great destruction. But the biblical image suggest just the opposite. Jim Manley's song, "Spirit, Spirit of gentleness, blow through the wilderness, calling and free; Spirit, Spirit of restlessness, stir me form placidness, wind, wind on the sea."

A fish in the water is not aware of the life sustaining medium in which it finds itself. We live in the life sustaining medium of the Spirit. Unlike the fish, we can be aware of it. I see Manley's words as a prayer. A prayer that reminds us that we can fall spiritually into lazy, hazy, crazy days - and not just in summer. As we celebrate the gift of the Spirit, let us use Manley's words as a prayer of our own that the Spirit will "stir us from restlessness," calling us out to be alive and empowered with a vision of who we are and how we do mission in Jesus' name.

- The Consistory approved a proposal to install new weather stripping and locks on the front doors of the arcade. This work has been completed.
- The Consistory approved a proposal to renovate the Education Building basement. All of the old fluorescent lights in the basement as well as those in the men's room, the office, and the kitchen are to be replaced with new LED light fixtures. New acoustic ceiling tiles will be installed in the basement and the metal grids will be painted. Ceiling fans will be installed in the four classrooms. The three bathrooms in the basement will have new exhaust fans installed. This work has been completed
- Pictures of the property in the Church (including the stained glass windows) and Education Building have been taken by Jennifer Stull. She is putting together a picture inventory in print and on CD's so that Faith will have documentation of our assets in case of theft or fire.
- A Faith UCC Website is being created by Jennifer and Kevin Sunday. Once it is up and running, we will let you know how to access it.
- The Consistory approved an outreach opportunity presented by Jennifer Stull. A medical mission trip to Honduras this summer was in need of school supplies and the Consistory voted to give monetary support for this trip so that needed supplies could be bought.
- The Consistory approved a one-year renewal of the lease for the tenants at the Parsonage.

Every two years the UCC gathers with delegates from all over the country to meet, learn, deliberate, pray, and worship. Several years ago the decision was made to meet in what are called second tier cities, rather than those places known for their conventions. This year the Synod meets in Baltimore from Friday June 30 to Tuesday, July 4, with between three and four thousand delegates and guests, not to mention several hundred volunteers. One of the many highlights is the worship service on Sunday afternoon at 3:00 P.M. If you have never been to a General Synod, this experience is worth the effort.

The biblical narrative of Pentecost is given in the second chapter of the Book of Acts. Present were about one hundred and twenty followers of Christ (Acts 1:15), including the Twelve Apostles (i.e. the Eleven faithful disciples and Matthias who was Judas' replacement) (Acts 1:13, 26), his mother Mary, various other women disciples and his brothers (Acts 1:14).^[20]

Their reception of the Holy Spirit in the Upper Room is recounted in Acts 2:1-6:

And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak with other languages, as the Spirit gave them utterance. And there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven. Now when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded, because that every man heard them speak in his own language. [21]

While those on whom the Spirit had descended were speaking in many languages, the Apostle Peter stood up with the eleven and proclaimed to the crowd that this event was the fulfillment of the prophecy ("I will pour out my spirit"). In Acts 2:17, it reads: "And in the last days,' God says, 'I will pour out my spirit upon every sort of flesh, and your sons and your daughters will prophesy and your young men will see visions and your old men will dream dreams." He also mentions (2:15) that it was the third hour of the day (about 9:00 am). Acts 2:41 then reports: "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls."

Peter stated that this event was the beginning of a continual outpouring that would be available to all believers from that point on, Jews and Gentiles alike.
