And even those who go to a church service go home afterward and go right back to work, trying to get all the stuff done that they didn't get accomplished during their work week. That's not a Sabbath! Even in your busiest season, there is no excuse not to rest. You may be a tax accountant, but you still have to take a day off in April. You may work in retail, but you still have to take a day off during the Christmas season. Even a farmer must take a day off in harvest or planting season.


What are you supposed to do on your Sabbath?
