The Parable of the Sower

MATTHEW 13: 1-23

1 That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake.

2 Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. 3 Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. 4 As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. 5 Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. 6 But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. 7 Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. 8 Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. 9 Whoever has ears, let them hear." 10 The disciples came to him and asked, "Why do you speak to the people in parables?" 11 He replied, "Because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them. 12 Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them. 13 This is why I speak to them in parables: "Though seeing, they do not see; though hearing, they do not hear or understand. 14 In them is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah: "You will be ever hearing but never understanding; you will be ever seeing but never perceiving. 15 For this people's heart has become calloused; they hardly hear with their ears, and they have closed their eyes. Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts and turn, and I would heal them.' 16 But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear. 17 For truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it. 18 "Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: 19 When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. 20 The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. 21 But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. 22 The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. 23 But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."



- The next Consistory Meeting will be held on Monday, November 12, at 7:00 pm.
- The terms of the following two Consistory Members will be up at the end of 2018: Jim Bostian and Jennifer Stull. Both Jim and Jennifer have volunteered to serve another two-year term. The formal election will be held at the Annual Congregational Meeting in January 2019.
- A major landscaping project at the Parsonage has been completed. Twice this year, the tenants have had water in the basement. Hopefully, this project will correct the water problem. A French drain was installed in the backyard of the house; new sidewalks were installed in both the front and back of the house; new higher window wells were installed; new downspout drains with pop-up emitters on the ends were installed underground so that they drain away from the house; and the house foundation was backfilled with soil to raise the grade and provide proper drainage away from the house.
- After the rain storm of September 7-10, leaks were discovered around the Fireside Room chimney, around the Bell Tower, and in the Arcade ceiling. These leaks have been addressed.
- A new shed has been ordered for use by the tenants as the old one was in need of major repairs.

We all have lost loved ones. Walking through illness and asking God for healing that we know He may or may not bring is hard with children who are watching and learning about faith. The beauty of

childlike faith is that in their innocence they find it easy to believe. Most children have not experienced the reality of deep disappointment that often shakes the faith of the rest of us. So how do we share faith with children when we ourselves have had our faith tested?

Hebrews 11:1 (ESV) says:

"Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."

The very definition of faith as expressed by the writer of Hebrews focuses on the hope and conviction of our faith and not on the results. Though many of the Bible stories we use to share faith have positive endings, it's important to highlight the journey and act of faith <u>before the outcome</u>. This will build a faith in our children that is focused on their relationship with Jesus rather than merely what he can do for them. Though we believe and do not doubt, God may not do everything we ask of Him in faith because He knows better than we do exactly what we need in each situation. And this is perhaps the greatest lesson of **faith** – believing without doubt and trusting Him ...whatever the outcome.

An elderly lady was well-known for her faith and for her boldness in talking about it. She would stand on her front porch and shout "*Praise the Lord!*" Next door to her lived an atheist who would get so angry at her proclamations he would shout "*there ain't no Lord*!" Hard times set in on the elderly lady, and she prayed for GOD to send her some assistance. She stood on her porch and shouted "*Praise the Lord, God! I need food! I am having a hard time. Please Lord, send me some groceries!*" The next morning, the lady went out on her porch and noted a large bag of groceries and shouted "*Praise the Lord*", then the neighbor jumped our from behind a bush and said "*AHA, I told you there was no Lord, I bought those groceries, God didn't*" The lady started jumping up and down clapping her hands and said "*Praise the Lord!
