DEATH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist, well-known for baptizing Jesus in the river Jordan, is commonly referred to as the precursor or forerunner of Jesus. There are many parallels to the lives of John the Baptist and Jesus, as they both preached about repentance and the Kingdom of God and criticized the religious leaders of their day. Additionally, they were both considered martyrs persecuted by officials of the Roman Empire.

According to the gospels of Matthew and Mark, John the Baptist had been imprisoned because he condemned Herod Antipas for divorcing his wife and unlawfully taking Herodias, the wife of his brother Herod Philip I. On Herod's birthday, Herodias' daughter, Salome, danced before the king and his guests and Herod was so pleased that he promised to give her any request she desired. Out of revenge for criticizing her marriage to Herod, Herodias told Salome to ask for the head of John the Baptist on a platter. Although Herod was dismayed by the request, he reluctantly agrees to have John executed in the prison of Machaerus.

Burial Place

The burial-place of John the Baptist was traditionally said to be at the Nabi Yahya Mosque (Saint John the Baptist Mosque)

in Sebastia in current Palestinian territories, and mention is made of his relics being honored there around the middle of the 4th century.

The historians Rufinus and Theodoretus record that the shrine was desecrated under Julian the Apostate around 362, the bones being partly burned. A portion of the rescued relics were carried to Jerusalem, then to Alexandria, where on 27 May 395, they were laid in the basilica newly dedicated to the Forerunner on the former site of the temple of Serapis. The tomb at Sebaste continued, nevertheless, to be visited by pious pilgrims, and Saint Jerome bears witness to miracles being worked there. The Coptic Christian Orthodox Church also claim to hold the relics of Saint John the Baptist. These are to be found in a monastery in Lower Egypt between Cairo and Alexandria. It is possible, with permission from the monks, to see the original tomb where the remains were found.

Also, in 2010, bones were discovered in the ruins of a Bulgarian church in the St. John the Forerunner Monastery (4th–17th centuries) on the Black



Sea island of St. Ivan and two years later, after DNA and radio carbon testing proved the bones belonged to a Middle Eastern man who lived in the 1st century AD, scientists said that the remains could conceivably have belonged to John the Baptist. [70][71] The remains, found in a reliquarium, are presently kept in the Sts. Cyril and Methodius Cathedral in Sozopol. [70][7

God's fire the flame will kindle.


Kneel in praise, thanksgiving raise, The God of goodness ponder; Then arise, to face the skies, With grateful, silent wonder.

To Whom It May Concern:

My name is Galen Hahn. I am a retired pastor in the United Church of Christ. I filled in at Faith UCC during the summer of 1970. During these days of retirement I have been going through older files and came upon this memory. I don't know that it will mean much to you folks, but it brought back some fond memories to me. So, I thought I would share it with you.

During the summer of 1970 I filled the pulpit at Faith for six weeks. Though I had filled many pulpits in the Catoctin Association during my college days, I had never filled one for six weeks straight. Early in those weeks I asked if you might be interested in having a hymn sing. You agreed. So, on September 6, 1970 we had one and a lunch to follow. I was dating a young woman, Sandy Ball, whom the next summer became my wife. She played accordion music during the service with Mrs. Mary Frances Bostian and provided background music, "Church in the Wildwood," as I read Mrs. Erma Stull Grove's "Country Church." The service was very moving to all.

This was the summer after my first year in seminary. You folks were searching for a pastor. Several men said to me during the covered dish lunch that they would like to consider a call to me, but two years of waiting was too long for the congregation.

Almost two years later, during my final year in seminary, I took a course under Father Henri Nouwen called "Christian Spirituality in the Contemporary World." At the beginning of that course we were asked to write a paper on strong spiritual influences in our lives. I identified this experience at Faith as a strong influence. I had gone to college at Catawba in North Carolina where my major was sociology. Though I sincerely felt a calling to go on to seminary, I was not sure in what area my ministry might be conducted. But after this experience at Faith, I was committed to parish ministry.

I never had an opportunity to share this information with your folks back then. But this year, 2020, I am remembering that it happened fifty years ago. So, I want to thank you for this powerful influence in my early life. May you continue blessing others who might hear God's call to this still important ministry
